Support to Social Economy in Asturias: FFES



Concept

The social economy sector is primarily composed of co-ops, mutuals and associations run under a set of ethical principles:

- Organizations are member-driven
- Autonomy and independence
- Democratic decision-making processes
- People and work first, not capital.



Social Economy in Spain

In Spain, jointly-owned and democratically-controlled enterprises fall into three different legal forms:

- Co-ops
- Labor Societies
- Agriculture Societies of Transformation (eq. Farmers' coops)



Common features

- .- Controlled by workers
- .- Members contribute equally
- .- Members usually receive limited compensation, if any, on capital subscribed as a condition of membership



Most relevant differences

<u>Co-ops</u>: Members have equal voting rights (one member, one vote) regardless of contribution and usually receive limited compensation, if any, on capital subscribed as a condition of membership

<u>Labor Societies</u>: Voting rights and compensation according to contribution of capital.



Background

- General economic crisis. 70ies and 80ies
- Particularly difficult situation in the industrial sector leading to the creation of most laboral societies.
- Some companies in deep trouble become worker-owned companies.



Antecedentes creación FFES

FFES kick-off

- Agreement at regional level
- Purpose: Coordinate actions related with co-ops and labor societies geared towards job creation.
- Created in 1989 as a non-profit organization delivering free services to Social Economy companies and start-ups.
- Patrons: Government of Asturias, Trade Unions (U.G.T., CC.OO), Social Economy Associations (ASATA and Food and Farmers' Coops)
- Public funding



Goals

- Promote the development of the Social Economy sector.
- Disseminate the main features and legal aspects of Social Economy companies.
- Support start-ups in the social economy
- Collaborate in consolidating social economy companies.



Activities

Consultancy: technical start-up assistance

Training: design and delivery of training courses catering to the needs of Social Economy companies and unemployed people

Awareness: dissemination of specific characteristics of Social Economy companies via talks, website,

Networking: collaboration with other institutions in order to support this type of companies.



Start-up support

- Advice on all aspects of social economy business planning including financial and legal issues.
- •Support in the application for the capitalization of unemployment benefits.
- Support with start-up paperwork
- •Support in the application for specific grants.



Support to consolidated companies and lobbying.

- Advice on specific issues regarding legal form (membership, articles of association, grants...)
- •Training mainly for members and workers, or start-ups., dirigidal principalmente a socios y trabajadores de estas empresas o a promotores con proyecto empresarial.
- •Dissemination: organization of events, conferences, research and networking with regional authorities and other institutions.
